Bring your class to the heart of Armadale for a free program **At the Museum!** These programs link directly to the curriculum of the recommended age groups, however small adjustments can be made to suit most groups and specific needs. We have the following programs on offer:

Local Government – City of Armadale schools only (Years 3 to 6)

Through the exploration of some old (and not so old) objects and stories, find out what our local government was, and now is, responsible for. Take a seat in the local council chambers for a chat with the Mayor or a Councillor about their job, and find out how you can actively participate in your local community by role-playing how your ideas can become reality.

Nidja Noongar Boodjar - Here is Aboriginal Country (Cross Curricular Years 1 to 6)

With a rich and long history, the Noongar way of life before British settlement relied completely on their understanding of Country. Discover a little about who the Noongar people are through the framework of the six seasons, artefacts, foods, dreamtime stories and language. Explore the park through the eyes of a Noongar child and create your own cultural art to take home.

Our Pioneers (Years 1 to 3)

Be immersed into the lives of early Armadale settlers through our History House Museum *or* Bert Tyler Vintage Museum, and experience what it was like to be a student a hundred years ago! Settle around a 100+ year old tree to find out about some of the changes it has seen, and try some popular games of the past!

World at War - Armadale (Years 2 to 4)

When local people enlist as soldiers or nurses to fight for their country, the impact will be felt throughout their community. By visiting Memorial park, exploring the History House Museum *World at War* display and handling some objects used on the battle field, investigate what life may have been like for those fighting, for those left at home, and how and why we remember wars and the sacrifices made.
